1. **What is the purpose of a main motion? (8)**
 The purpose of a main motion is to present an item of business for consideration and action by the chapter.
2. **Does a point of order require a second? (33)**
 A point of order does not require a second.
3. **What is the purpose of referring a motion to a committee? (21)**
 The purpose of referring a motion to a committee is to place the question temporarily in a committee.
4. **Explain how nominations may be closed and reopened. (54)**
 Nominations may be closed by a two-thirds vote on the motion to close nominations.
 Nominations may be reopened by a majority vote on the motion to reopen nominations.
5. **When a special committee files its final report, should a motion to discharge the committee be brought before the assembly? (89)**
 When a special committee files its report, the committee ceases to exist. A motion to discharge the committee is not required.
6. **If a motion is on the floor and the meeting is adjourned, what happens to the motion on the floor? (100)**
 If a meeting is adjourned while an item of business is on the floor, that business will be brought back at the next regular meeting in the form of Unfinished Business.
7. **How may nominations be made? (53)**
 Nominations may be made by a committee or from the floor by a member.
8. **Is a second required to a parliamentary inquiry, and what type of vote is required? (59)**
 A parliamentary inquiry does not require a second; a vote is not required.
9. **What vote is required to suspend the rules? (44)**
 A majority vote is required to suspend the rules.
10. **Is the motion to reconsider debatable and amendable? (78)**
 The motion to reconsider is debatable if the question to be reconsidered is debatable, and it is unamendable.
